

Dear Friends in Christ,

Praise God! He is so Good to His Children-ALL THE TIME-Amen! He has been so faithful to sustain, guide and provide for all of our needs on the mission field. For almost 10 years, He has performed awesome miracles for us in Haiti, both great and small. God brings in much needed medicine and other supplies time after time when our shelves were empty and our needs so great. He has helped us touch thousands of lives with healing and restoration and souls with the Hope and Love of Jesus Christ.

Our computer in Haiti crashed; and because of some situations, it took several months to get it fixed. We know we are enclosing a lot of information with this mailing and hope you will take time to read it over.

Zach has been working here in the states finishing the requirements for his retirement and our health insurance coverage. Gretchen has been gathering supplies, making contacts for donations, and helping at a food bank and ministry for girls recovering from drug and alcohol abuse. She returns to Haiti August 5th. Lori is here fresh from the field with exciting front-line stories and pictures of God's Grace and Mercy. She will go back home Sept. 17th.

God's Work through us has grown tremendously in the last few years. Besides a busy clinic (200 patients per day), we've been maintaining a Rescue Center for burned and malnourished children. Since last June, over 300 children

have received medical care, food, love, prayer and an opportunity for a vibrant life. Many of these little ones, we pray and believe, will grow up serving the True and Living God. They will make a lasting difference in their village and in the country of Haiti.

Although our work has increased, we have failed in increasing our support base of monthly giving. We started with 2 family members and 1 Haitian worker. Today, our family has grown to 5 adults with 4 children and 38 Haitian workers. With the exception of January 2003, our support has at times not even made payroll for our workers since last June. (We are still at the same funding level we were in the mid 1990's.)

God has worked this out for us as Zach has been able to work and put those funds into the mission. We girls have cleaned houses, babysat, and done other odd jobs to help meet the needs. Hopefully in December, our family will all be back in Haiti full time. We need that to keep things going, share the work load, and fulfill God's Call. We have to build our base of support, close the Rescue Center or put Zach back on road work next year.

Friends, we've had special needs in times past and it is wonderful how God touches people to give and help. We all greatly appreciate your sacrifice and have overcome crisis because you cared and gave.

Right now, we are seeking monthly financial commitments. It

takes about \$100 a month for 24hr/day total care for each child rescued in the center. We were going to take about 15 children at a time we haven't had less than 30 and sometimes as many as 43. We are sure if we didn't take these children in. they would die in days or hours. Besides the children, there is the clinicmedicine. lab tests, surgeries. transportation, and other related costs of getting people back to good health. We must pay rent on our home. Rescue Center and clinic. We must fuel and maintain our generators for power. Our suburban is another desperate need we have. It is a 1986 and sits in need of repair more than it runs. It's very difficult to get supplies to our remote mountain area without a vehicle, but we've done it with God's Help.

If you, your church, or group want to help a mission that is bearing fruit, please consider being a part of what we are doing in reaching the lost for Christ. We are ready to bring evidence of our work before churches, Sunday school classes, church boards or other interested groups. We will speak to 1 or 1000 with the same excitement, enthusiasm, and commitment.

God called us as a family and we believe He wants us to remain working as such on the mission field. We believe in what we are doing. We see the daily benefit of our health care and education. Everyone in our zone of over 40,000 people knows God sent us - won't you or your church consider help in keeping us there?

Can i have adrink?

Clean drinking water is a huge problem for many in Haiti, including us. We have to add drops of bleach into our water to decrease the organisms that can cause typhoid fever, cholera, and other intestinal problems. Though this process is necessary for the moment, we would like to buy a water filter as a longer term solution. There is an affordable 2 bucket system available in Haiti. It costs \$120 American and will last approximately 2 years. We would like to buy 3 sets for a total of \$360.

Did you ever wonder what our shopping list looks like? Here is a partial list of some items we must buy or find to feed and care for 30 children for one month in the Rescue Center.



720 EGGS

800 HOTDOGS

150 POUNDS OF RICE

70 + CANS OF POWDERED BABY FORMULA

3000 DIAPERS

8 GALLONS OF OIL

35 HEAD OF GARLIC

10 GALLONS OF LIQUID SOAP

4 GALLONS OF BLEACH

260 LONG BARS OF LYE WASH SOAP

28 CHICKENS

40 FISH

60 JARS OF PEANUT BUTTER



your trip be a success.





This 8 year old boy was sick for several months. His voodoo believing parents took him to the hougan (witch doctor) for the treatment until all of their money was gone. They went to a children's hospital and were refused to enter. The doctors told his father to just take him back home because he would die. They brought him to us as a last chance, but were reluctant to trust white, Christian missionaries. They had no choice; he would probably die either way. Within 5 days of an improved diet; his kidneys began functioning, he lost 14 pounds of fluid, and he gained one HUGE smile! When his family came to visit, they could hardly recognized him. The change left them speechless for a moment, then they told us the whole family wanted to be saved.

MORINGA TREES

The leaves from this tree are harvested, dried in the shade, then pounded by mortal and pedestal to make a fine powder. This powder is tasteless and can be added to virtually anything to increase the nutritional quality. In some places in Africa, there is almost no malnutrition because they use this cheap and easy to find form of protein. It is good for high blood pressure and diabetes. Infant mortality dropped in areas when pregnant mothers began using in daily. The tree itself is readily found in Haiti and can be grown in almost any soil, with little water. It has been named by some to be a miracle tree. God knows what he is doing. He gave this miracle to the areas that need it the most. We are trying to push this tree for reforestation and for it's nutritional value. Margaret has written up a research project it order to study the actual help it gives it relation to weight gain. We plan to add it to the diets of those in the Rescue Center. We will also educate clinic patients as to preparation and nutritional content. Hopefully, this leaf powder will be a indigenous and inexpensive solution malnutrition in Haiti and other parts of the world.

The 2 semi-containers full of relief supplies for Haiti were inspected, released and mostly unloaded the last week of February. A NOTE FROM LORI

I wanted to update you on an incident that happened to me on Feb 12th. As many of you already know, I was caring for a lady in the end-stages of AIDS. She was blind and bedridden and refused to inform her family of her

HIV status. They assumed that it was a Voodoo curse put upon her by an enemy. They were trying anything to help her and eventually brought her back to us. Several years ago, she became involved with a man from a larger city whom the family did not know. Against the family's wishes, she moved in with him and they had 3 children. When he died 2 1/2 years ago, she moved back to her home town with the kids. She lost weight and had horrible skin infection that couldn't clear up. We sent her to be tested and she found out she was HIV+. We begged her to test her children before she got too sick. We gave her referral letters and money, but she said they family would suspect something if she took her children to the capital without good explanation. So she never did. She didn't want her last dying days to be full of "I told you so." So the family carried her over hour to us to receive IV fluids and medicines in hopes of her recovery. IV fluids are often seen as a cure-all and most would take an IV for the common cold if they could. Seeing the family's desperation, I could not turn them away back into the hands of the witchdoctor. I told them I would do what I could and pray that God would help and comfort her. No false hopes or empty promises were given. In Haiti, illness seems to be classified into two groups - "a sickness of a doctor" and "not a sickness of a doctor." The later caused by the devil, evil forces, a poison, or a curse. These two groups of illnesses have two totally different forms of treatment. doctor's illness treated with a doctor's medicine (IV, shots, pills) and a Voodoo illness treated by a hougan's medicine (syrups, charms, rituals, etc). I tried to explain that this was a doctor's sickness that did not have a cure, but that I would try to ease her pain and

discomfort. Indeed. she was dehydrated and would benefit from an IV. We have no hospital rooms or beds and I had no place to put her. We decided to put her under the tin roof lean-to that our patients sit under as they wait to been seen. Lots had been happening and I was exhausted. I had been up till 12:30 that morning caring for a sick baby that died at 3:30. This had made 5 children that had already died in our care since the beginning of the month. After preparing him for burial, I tried to get in a few more hours of sleep. I woke up to find a boy with a brittle bone disease had broken his leg for the third time since June. A Canada team came that day from another mission to help us count and bag medicine. And there was about 250 patients waiting to be seen. When she came to get the IV, I turned down Licia's offer to help me because we were just so busy. I didn't want to take away any time from anything she was doing. Though I doubled gloved and watched what I was doing, I didn't watch close enough. As I was putting in the IV, more blood than I had expected came out and the patients waiting were trying to help me. I wanted to protect them from exposure. I drew my hand back to pick up a gauze pad and the needle laying on the bed barely pricked the heal on my hand. I secured the IV, then went inside to clean my hand. I told mom and started crying. How could this happen to me? Why didn't I ask for Licia's help? My family and boyfriend were a great support to me. In the hours following, I was able to inform our pastor stateside of the problem. He contacted doctors and a wonderful display of God's Love was poured out on me. Within 3 days, the medicine was purchased and hand carried to me. Taking this medicine reduces my chances of becoming HIV+ by 79%. I must take it for a month and be tested in the following months. I believe that what the devil meant for my harm will be turned around for His Glory. In a newsletter several months ago, I wrote how our next big battle would be with AIDS. I just didn't know that battle might be mine. I know some of you don't really understand why we came to Haiti or what keeps us here after something like this happens to one of us. The short answer is God. The long answer could fill a book. I can only say that this incident has given more of a passion for the dying. This was not my first nor last experience caring for HIV patients. I will not hesitate when the next one comes, though I will ask for help - help from those around me here in Haiti and help from those of you in the states. I am only one and I only have two hands. I am often ashamed to beg and ask for aid and assistance as some might see it as a sign of weakness. But I am weak and only He can make us strong. There is a Haitian proverb that says "many hands make the load light." How true. I am asking for your hands, your time, your support for these people that God so unconditionally loves. The Zachary family can not do this by ourselves. We need your hands - in the states and here in Haiti. There are no words that I can put upon these pages to express my gratitude to all of those who helped make it possible for me to get the very expensive medicine down here to me. I can never repay you nor thank you sufficiently. I appreciate each and everyone of you. But there is one lesson that I learned in all of this - if I would have asked for help before maybe nothing like this would have happened. I cannot fail in this again. I will ask you for help when we need it. I can't afford not to.
