Prayer requests for our work:

Pray for the organization to find a pathway to move forward with some accreditation with the Haitian Health Department and the Haitian government in general. There are several aspects of compliance with the Haitian government that are unclear and we are receiving contradictory information, so pray we find some clarity and can make progress.

13. Pray for the Denton Program that is run by the USA Department of Defense where they bring humanitarian supplies to Haiti free of charge and clear of customs. Some Haitian officials have created difficulties in allowing that program to continue, so agree with us in prayer that those working to resolve the situation will have success and that avenue to get much needed supplies will remain open to us.

14. Pray for our chaplains and everyone in our staff to continue to shine the light of Christ brightly and we see a greater harvest of souls in 2021 of transformed lives and hearts of stones becoming hearts of flesh.
