The workshop and storage area will be built later this fall and made out of repurposed shipping containers. God willing, in the winter the cholera center will be remodeled and used as the clinic and inpatient nutrition center. Many thanks to you who have stood with us as the Lord has allowed us to care for over 160,000 patients during 27 years of serving the Lord here in Haiti. None of this work could happen without your support and participation and we are deeply grateful for your sacrifice and compassion. I was very worried about her and wondered if she was going to live, which she has. She is doing well, and for that I want to thank God. During her time of treatment she gained 5 1/2 pounds.

I felt like it was a good time to make the decision to follow Christ in my life. They gave me medicine for my son and talked to me about life's road and the choices we make along that road. I was so happy to make this decision becuase I feel like it is the best and most important decision of my life. I want to tell God a very special thank you because today He's accepted me as His child and I am part of the family of Christ.
