It is hard enough to grow up in Haiti, but harder still without a mother. Many children need and receive your support through foster care, formula, food boxes, malnutrition programs, and spiritual support. Thank you for generously giving to the care of orphans to show them love and hope.



Thank you so much for the support you show to our Hope children; fostered in loving homes within the Cazale community. Many of these children have special needs and have been abandoned. Others are in difficult situations that are neither safe nor healthy and their caregivers are unable to raise them. Remiline's story is one of pain turned into hope because your care turned into action. The four different caregivers in her short life have either died or been unable to properly care for her. She was admitted three times to our center for severe malnutrition before she was 3 years old. Now, with your support, she is thriving, healthy, and attending school. Your compassion for the 16 Hope families is amazing and fruitful. The children are blooming in their individual homes and their future is bright because you've turned love into action.

R.R.'s mom died when he was 3 months old and his aunt is now his caregiver. He was placed on the infant formula program until he was 18 months old and then transitioned to the monthly mamba program. R.R. is now 23 months old and recently graduated from the nutrition program. He and his aunt live with his grandparents in a 2 room cement block house with a tin roof. His aunt buys and resells various merchandise she hopes will make a good profit at the local markets. She says, "It is here at the clinic that I found the help R.R. needed. I didn't have the possibility of raising the finances other medical clinics would have charged to do all of the things he needed for his health. Thank you for the patience that you had with us. It is only God alone that can reward you for this. I'm praying for you all."





Dieunel lives with his dad and 5 other children in a 2 room house made of rocks and clay with a tin roof. His mother died several years ago and his dad is doing the very best he can as a farmer while raising his children. Sadly, most seasons the harvest is not enough to feed everyone. Dieunel was anemic and malnourished when he came to the clinic. With your monthly gift of \$10.00, his family and others receive a food box of rice and beans to supplement their nutrition. Thank you so much for providing food, showing compassion, and giving hope to this father and his children.

Josue lives with his family in a town about a 45-minute drive from the clinic. They have a one-room house with a tin roof and walls constructed from tarps. Josue's dad sews and makes bags for a living to support the family. When Josue came to the clinic, he was swollen with kwashiorkor and very anemic. He was admitted to the inpatient program where he lost the water weight, increased his hemoglobin, and gained 7 lbs 4 oz. He is now back at home with his family and doing well. Thank you for providing the supplies and staff needed to help him during his recovery in the Rescue Center.

He noticed that he was losing weight and getting weak. He has worked as a farmer in the past, but hadn't been able to do much lately since he has been sick.
