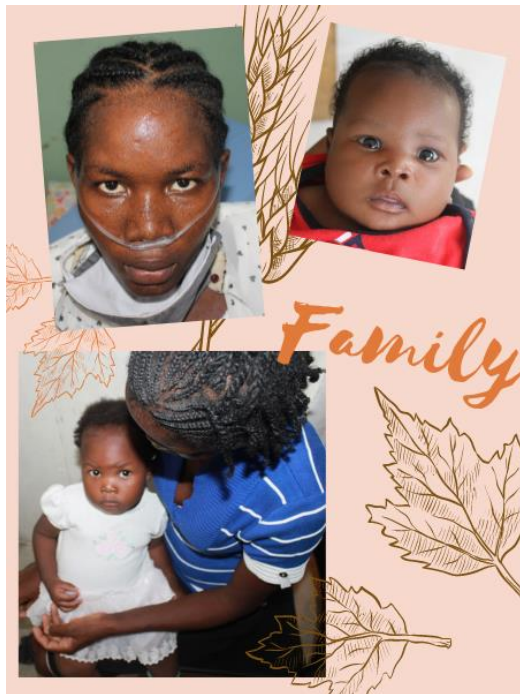




...hope in this life and the life to come...

One month after Kiesha was born, her mama came to the clinic in respiratory distress, was placed on 5 liters of oxygen, tested positive for COVID, and was transferred to a COVID unit in Port-au-Prince. Since the hospital would not admit her with her baby, Kiesha was left with us until a family member could come. It was a hard time for the family and Keisha was with us for 2 weeks until they were able to find someone to care for her. She did not become ill during her time in quarantine. Once she returned home, we provided infant formula and other support. Her mama was in the hospital for over a month and was very ill. It has been a slow road of recovery for the mama, but she is very thankful for the help offered from the clinic and the supply of infant formula given to her each month. Keisha has remained at a healthy weight for the past year and both mom and baby are doing well.

Words from Keisha mom:

I want to tell you thank you because you have helped me. After the help from God, if you were not here, I am sure that I would have died.

You not only thought on me and cared for me but also for my daughter. You cared for her when I could not, and I was at peace because I knew she was safe. I want to give all the glory to God because it is Him that sent you to this area of Cazale.

This soon to be mom is from Jn Rosse (about 5 hours from the clinic) and lives in a two-room rock and cement house covered with a tin roof with her husband and their first child. They work in their gardens planting beans, corn, bananas, and other foods. She decided to follow in our clinic because it was the closest and affordable. She thinks that it is a very good option for the poor to get good health care. She has had testing and a sonogram. Her pregnancy is developing well. We give her prenatal vitamins during her monthly clinic visits when we also do a check-up. She is on her way to a healthy delivery and baby. She says, "Thank you for the good ways that you have taken care of me. I've already followed here in the clinic for 4 months and I'm happy and satisfied with my care. May God bless you more and more each day."





I came to the clinic with my grandson. His mama has many problems and left him at my house. She has been gone now for many months. I do not know where she is and that makes me sad. My grandson was sick before I came to the clinic. He had been vomiting for about 1 month and was losing weight. The nurse told me he was severely malnourished and that made me sad. I decided to admit him for inpatient care because I saw that he might die. He stayed for care for 7 months. During that time, he gained almost 7 pounds. He is also walking, running, and playing now. When I saw him the day he came home, I was so shocked because he was so beautiful and healthy. I always say after God it is the doctors, nurses and those that have a good heart that saves lives. We cannot compare the work here at this clinic to another. Thank you to the doctors, nurses, and those that cared for my grandson. Those that took care of him when he was sick thank you. May God continue to bless each of you and the clinic.

B.A. is a 33-year-old man that works as a carpenter and recently visited the clinic because he has been sick. He spoke with a chaplain and prayed for salvation. He describes himself as someone that believes in the Word of God, but never committed to following Christ. He is now certain that God can do all things and he wants to be a strong believer. We prayed with him that God would heal him and take him out of or through the difficult place he is in. He wants to continue learning and growing in his faith. Ariana has had a difficult start in life but is doing much better now thanks to the support of donors like you. Her mother is doing her best to raise her and her two older siblings. Their father doesn't offer much support and no longer lives with them. Her mother buys items in bulk and resells them in the local markets to make money to feed her children. This common type of earning a living can barely care for them and many days they are just barely surviving. Ariana got sick with a cold and fever. Soon, she had diarrhea and her appetite decreased. Since her mother was barely able to feed the children, she tried home remedies and hoped that Ariana would recover. After a couple of weeks, her mother could tell she was losing weight, not playing, and getting weak. Once she saw her daughter's feet begin to swell, she came to the RHFH clinic searching for help. Ariana had severe malnutrition with complications and was admitted for inpatient care, where she stayed for 7 months. During that time, she gained 4 pounds and began walking on her own. Her mom is very thankful her daughter is happy and healthy now. A million thanks to each of you that donate money, time, and resources to save little ones like Ariana. We are thankful God used you to bring good health to this child and so many others.
