S. was in our infant formula program when she was younger. Her mama died when she was a newborn. She lives with her uncle and his family. There are 4 children and 2 adults that live in the home. The uncle drives a motorcycle around the local area and gives people rides to places for a small fee. He uses this money to care for the family. From the family: We would like to thank those at the clinic for helping our niece. She has been getting infant formula for over a year now. She has graduated that program and is now getting a food box each month. When S. mama first died we did not know if we could care for her. We were worried that we did not have enough funds for her. It has been a great help to receive extra help from the clinic. May God be praised.

Donsky is a 13 yr old boy that lives about a 30 minute walk to the clinic. His dad brought him in several months ago with severe stomachache and vomiting. He was referred to another hospital and they operated on him. His parents don't know what they did in surgery and we never got a report on his condition. He was discharged and sent back to our clinic with a 8-inch abdominal incision that was mildly infected and gaping open in a few places. Wound care and antibiotics were started. He began to slightly recover but was slow to heal. He was put on the PlumpyDoz program where he received a sack to eat each day. Daily wound care and monthly weigh-ins continued for three months until his wound was fully healed. He said, "Thank you because you helped me find good care. I was really scared. I thought that I was going to die with this illness. Thank you for the good medications and dressings that healed my wound. God will bless you. Thank you so so much!"





Phanie is a 49 year old woman with diabetes. She lives in a 2 room house with a porch that is made of rock and cement with a tin roof. There are five people that live in the house - her, her husband, and 3 kids. She sells plantains in the local market to make a living for her family. Her diabetes was first discovered many years ago when she came to the clinic with a leg wound. When oral medications couldn't lower her glucose levels, she began insulin injections and has had much success keeping her levels close to normal. She sends her thanks to those that donate towards her insulin and care because she feels that she would have already died without it.

D.V. is a 62 year old man that receives a monthly food box when he visits the clinic for a check-up. He, his wife and their 5 children live in a one room house made of poles and tarps and covered with a tin roof. They are farmers and live off their seasonal harvests. Several months ago, he was having frequent fevers and felt very bad. After testing, it was discovered that he had tuberculosis (TB) and started treatment. It is important to have good nutrition while taking TB treatment so he was put on the food box program to supplement his diet. He has completed treatment and is feeling much better. His fevers stopped just a few weeks after treatment began and he has gained over 19 pounds. Thank you to all of those that give to the food box program that make an impact in the lives of many patients like D.V.
