My daughter became ill and I went to a clinic near my home. The people at the clinic said if your child is swollen with water like she was that you need to go to Cazale. So I went with her to the clinic. She was very sick and needed to be admitted for care. I said in my head my daughter is going to die, but I left it in God's hands. By the grace of God, she is alive today and not swollen anymore. She is healthy and laughing and playing. I tell myself if I would not have come to this clinic my daughter would be dead today. I want to tell God thank you for giving her life and may he bless those at the clinic.

Dieujuste is a 76-year-old pastor and farmer who started getting large open wounds on his legs in December of 2018. He tried to treat them at his house, but finally came to the clinic in May 2019 when they were severe. There were areas from his knees down that were open down to the muscle and tendons. He consulted with other doctors, did tests for circulation, and it was determined that he didn't need amputations. UNNA boots were prescribed and we did that wound care until we ran out of those and then switched to vaseline gauze. Other donated materials like sterile gauze, gloves, ACE bandages, betadine, and more were also used to help him heal. He came daily for so long that he decided to move to Cazale. He's been following for 32 months and it looks like he is going to finally find a solution for his chronic wounds. He says, "I tell God thank you even if I'm not quite healed yet. Thank you to all the nurses who took care of me so well that I could have this big change in my legs. I hope that God blesses those that help the clinic function and that you always have the possibility to help others in difficult situations. Thank you to everyone for the patience you had for my care and healing."





A. came to the clinic with her mama, sick with fever and coughing. She was admitted to the outpatient mamba program for moderately malnourished children. Though she had appointments to come every Friday to be checked by the medical staff and receive packs of medika mamba, her mom stopped coming after around a month. When she saw her child was still sick after another month, she returned to the clinic. When she came back, she said she was discouraged because she didn't see quick results. She was readmitted to the program and we asked her to have patience and faith in the process that her daughter would gain weight and get well. She did and within two months, she reached her goal weight.

Jn Yvenel became sick about 3 weeks before coming to the clinic. He had diarrhea and did not want to eat much. Then, he began to have edema in his ankles and feet. Within a week it was all over his body. He still did not feel like eating and was having trouble taking deep breaths and sleeping. His mom decided to bring him to the clinic and he was admitted for inpatient care. Within 10 days we began to see a total change in his body. His edema began to decrease and he began to feel better. This led to him beginning to eat more and then also got him walking around more. With his edema gone he was up and playing with the other children. Within 7 weeks he was healed and returned home with his family. He continues to follow each month in the clinic for check-ups.
