I have been working at RHFH since 2002. I have seen many children that come in that are very sick. Many times, I do not think they will live. One example of this is a child named Bedayson. He was so swollen that his legs split open and his skin was falling off in many places. Other places in his body had holes in them and were rotting. Even his mom said she felt like he was going to die. We did not see much change in him for several weeks. He slept all day and we had to wake him up to eat and take a bath. He was always in pain and sad. We did not lose hope that is important in this work. We kept passing cream on his wounds, we kept giving him nutrition through an NG tube, we changed him and gave him affection and love. Then we began to see a change. He began to become beautiful in front of our eyes. We thanked God. He was laughing and eating on his own. It is me today that is telling you that things happen here that we cannot explain so we say thank you God and then thank you to the clinic. God is big and can-do great things. God saved Bedayson from death. I pray that his mom will continue to care for him and come to her appointments at the clinic. I pray that in many years I will see him again and will remember what God has done for his life.

We are some of the nannies that work with the kids on the Rescue Center. We wanted to say thank you to those that have sent diapers to us here in Haiti. For many years we used diapers that we had to use safety pins with. It was ok but we change a lot of diapers each day and they would get lost or we would stick ourselves with them and it was just not the best way to care for the kids. But it was what we had at the time. God blessed us with these new types of diapers. They are very colorful and have snaps on them. WE LOVE THEM! They work well for the children and even those that are very small. It makes our work easier when we have the materials we need to help us better care for the children.





I'm a farmer of corn, grains, and pigeon peas. I live in a two-room house by myself. I had a bad cough and headache, so I came to the clinic. After some tests, they told me I was sick with tuberculosis. It was really making me feel bad and it was hard to work and take care of myself. I started taking the pills they said were good for this. The clinic gave me food to eat because they said it was very important to eat well to gain my strength and weight back. I'm done with the treatment now and feel completely better. I'm happy because I was always getting sick, but now I'm not. I thank those that took care of me and put me in the food box program. I can see this was very good for my nutrition and health. Your assistance changed my life. Thank you!

Gilbert was brought to the clinic by his aunt his mother left several months ago and has not returned. He began showing signs of kwashiorkor before coming to the clinic. His aunt was worried about him and knew it was a serious illness. He also had diarrhea and a fever when admitted. During his 4 months stay he lost weight from his edema and then was able to gain back 6 pounds to reach his goal weight. From his family: I feel like the clinic had a lot of patience with Gilbert so that he could live. I am happy and want to say thank you and that I will pray for you. Thank you for giving him good care.



My name is Leones. I want to thank God that after 3 years of being sick I am finally feeling like I am getting better. My stomach has been swollen for 3 years and I have been to many clinics and doctors. This is the first place I feel like I have found a solution. Since the first time I came to the clinic there were people that asked me if they could pray for me and then they talked to me and encouraged me. I am thankful for that because when you are sick you can become discouraged. I have been taking the medications and I feel so much better. To God be all the Glory!!
