V. weighed 4 pounds 4 ounces when she was 10 days old. This was her mama's first child. She was small and people were giving her advice to give the baby formula. When she came to the clinic, she asked the nurse which formula would be best for her daughter. We told her breastfeeding was best and admitted the mom to our outpatient Mamba Djanm program. We gave 2 sacks of this peanut butter that has added vitamins and minerals to eat each day. We use it for children that have moderate malnutrition, pregnant and breastfeeding moms that are low weight. Within a few months, V. had gained over 6 pounds. Her mama is happy that she was able to continue to breastfeed only and that her baby is well and healthy.

Hi! My name is Henry. When I was a young man, I fell and damaged my leg. Back then there were not many doctors and hospitals around. The damage was permanent and since that time I cannot walk on my own. I have used crutches or a walker for many years. This did not stop me when I was younger. I worked and had a garden. I grew corn, grains, yams, watermelon, potatoes, beans of many kinds over the years. Now I am 70 years old and living on my own. I come to the clinic once a month to get medications. I also get a box of FMSC rice and that helps me to be able to eat. I am glad to be able to still get around.



Kelson was severely malnourished in the fall of 2017. He is also blind. He returned home with his family after 4 months of inpatient care. Since that time, he has been following in the clinic each month and receiving a box of FMSC rice. Here is what his mama had to say.

My child was very sick. He was suffering. I went to the clinic. They admitted him for inpatient care. I could not stay with him each day because I am a single mom and my other kids needed me. I came twice a week to visit him. I was very happy and excited to see the changes in him each week. When he came home, I worked very hard each month to feed him well. When I come to the clinic and they say I am doing a good job caring for my son I am encouraged. This gives me strength to continue in life.
