When Chrislene first came to the clinic, she was sick with a chronic cough and malnutrition. She was diagnosed and treated for tuberculosis for 9 months. She lives with 12 other people in a rock and clay house with 4 rooms. They were screened for TB, but everyone else tested negative. During her treatment, she received food boxes and free health care with the help of generous donors. She is finished with treatment and feeling great. She sends her thanks to the clinic and all those who make it possible to function for her and many other. She is happy she is feeling better and prays that everyone treated in the clinic will find help as she did. Thank you for those that give towards the food boxes and food for the sick and poor. It is a great help in time of need and much appreciated.

Jeannica was brought to the clinic by her mama. The family lives in a 3 room homemade of rocks, clay, and covered with a tin roof. The family are farmers and grow beans, corn, grains in their gardens. Jeannica was severely malnourished and was admitted to the inpatient program. She had fever, diarrhea, and her hair was beginning to fall out. She was able to gain over 5 pounds during her stay. From her mama: Thank you for helping my daughter. I did not have much hope for her to live. Now I see she is full of life and is talking and walking. I am very happy. May God continue to bless those that help those in need.





Christolin's mom died when he was a baby. His Godfather and birth father came to the clinic in search of help for infant formula. He was admitted to the program when he was a few months old. He spent 10 months on the program and has been able to maintain a healthy weight during that time. From his papa: I wanted to say thank you. I think to myself my child might not be here today without this help. Even if he does not have a mother, I see that he has developed well and is normal in his weight. I want you to know that I pray for you each day. I thank God first for all He has done. I pray that God will continue to bless this clinic so that they will continue to be able to give help to those in need and people that have lost hope in their lives.

The first time I came to the clinic was several years ago when I had cholera. I was very sick then but by the grace of God I recovered. Now this year I came back to the clinic because I had another illness. I just wanted to say thank you today to God for helping me when I am sick. I also want to thank you to the clinic because I know for sure, I would have died several years ago if it was not for the medical help I received. I thank God for his protection.



Medical items are in short supply. A local hospital was delivering twins and the second one really needed to be delivered by C-section. Lack of supplies made that impossible so the brilliant Haitian staff did their best and delivered both babies naturally. Mom and babies are healthy. During this maneuver, one of the doctors didn't have gloves. Imagine not have a simple pair of gloves. They are also treating gunshot wounds and are running low on wound care items. Once we heard this, we sent several boxes of supplies down to help and will continue to help as needed. Thanks to all of those that helped to send the containers down the end of 2021 and beginning of 2022. These blessings are not just for us, but for many others that serve the Haitian people. We are happy several organizations gave these supplies, our supporters shipped them to make them available, and we are able to collaborate with other local health institutions during this time of crisis.
