We have reached a time when all hospitals in the area are closed. It is thanks to the RHFH mission that many people get care in the midst of the disaster that is happening in our community.

Olima had been coming to the clinic for chronic leg ulcers before becoming so ill and anemic that he was unable to walk. Despite losing hope, RHFH arranged for him to stay and hired staff to care for him 24/7. It took several months for him to regain strength and almost a year to completely heal. Olima is so grateful to RHFH staff for giving him hope and saving his life.



I work at RHFH and care for sick and malnourished children. I remember when M. was abandoned in the clinic yard. We took her in, cared for her and loved her. Despite her family not being found, she was placed with a loving family in the area and is now healthy, attending school, and bringing joy to everyone who knows her. Seeing M. grow up surrounded with love and acceptance give me strength to continue this work. It reminds me that there is hope in the mission work we are doing.

Boxes of Medika Mamba continue to make their way over mountains paths each week to arrive at the clinic. Even with major roads being blocked and unsafe to travel on due to gang activity, God continues to make a way. We are thankful to our staff and others that continue to work and support us in our effort to help those that are sick and malnourished in our area.

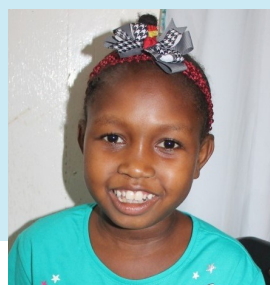


VISION: Physically, relationally, and spiritually healthy people contributing to thriving families and strong communities as God designed and desires.

I cannot remember what year it was but I was a small child then. I was burned on my stomach and also malnourished. My mom brought me to the clinic and, because we lived so far away, we stayed for treatment for the burns and malnutrition. I remember Madame Zach cared for me and Lori did my daily dressing changes. Once healed, I returned home and have not been back to the clinic. Today, I came to the clinic and am pregnant with my 4th child. I heard that Madame Zach and Mr. Zach died so I wanted to see their children and thank them. I do not feel like my words are enough to say thank you. Today, I am a mother because of RHFH and how they cared for me. They gave me life. God put this clinic in the path of my life. God, in His great love, continues to transform and save lives.



I live in a home built of clay and rocks that is covered with a tin roof. There are 9 of us that live in the house, 7 children and my husband and I. We are farmers and grow beans, corn, and sweet peppers. My daughter began losing weight last year. Each month, she continued to get smaller. We went to the clinic, and she was admitted to an outpatient program where we came each week for her to get weighed and receive packets of medika mamba. She did not gain weight and I was very sad. After talking with the nurse, we decided together to admit for her inpatient care at the Rescue Center. She was on the program for a total of 15 weeks and gained 15 pounds. I am happy that she looks so beautiful today and is healthy. I want to thank you for the way you helped my daughter.



F.P. was brought to the clinic by his papa, severely malnourished and ill. During his stay with us, there were several times that he was near death, but by the grace of God he pulled through. He gained a total of 5 ½ pounds during his time with us. His papa says, "Thank you for the help and services your provided to my son. I am thankful that he is healed and doing better. I am thankful that he is walking now and eating good food."
