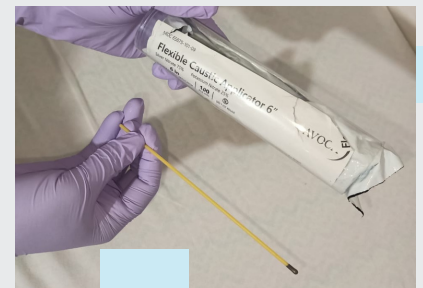

Immediate action was necessary, and our team quickly put him on oxygen. His mother stayed with him for the next five days while receiving medication and care. After five days of intensive care, his oxygen levels stabilized, and he was able to go home.

Johnny was admitted for inpatient care with severe malnutrition and stayed for seven weeks, gaining six pounds. From his mom: "Many times when we go see a doctor, they do not listen to all of our illness and just tell us to take a pill. I am happy that the nurse talked to me and explained what was wrong with my son. I am going to try very hard to make sure that he continues to eat well."



L.R. was brought to our clinic as a newborn after his mother passed away. His grandmother has been taking care of him and comes to our clinic every month to receive infant formula for him. After completing the program at 18 months, L.R. has made remarkable progress. His aunt expressed her gratitude, "Thank you so much for your support with the infant formula. When my daughter died, I was very sad, but caring for this little baby has brought so much joy into my life. I thank God for his life and how you have helped us."

After giving birth, my child's belly button wasn't healing properly which made for a difficult time. Seeking assistance, I came to the clinic and received medication as well as follow-up appointments. Within a week, I was pleased to see a significant improvement and the healing process was completed. The situation was truly bothering me, but I'm glad that it is fully healed now.

Teleson arrived at the clinic with a wound on his head from a fall, the medical staff quickly assessed his condition and provided him with the necessary care. After several weeks of rest and care, his wound had fully healed, and he was able to leave the clinic and return home. James and his family, who are farmers and grow beans and corn in their gardens, live in a small brick home with a tin roof. The family of four shares just one room. When their crops are ready, they sell them at an open-air market to earn a profit. Recently, James experienced edema in his legs and feet, which prompted his mother to take him to a clinic. Sadly, he was severely malnourished and weighed -4 standard deviations for his height. He was admitted to the hospital for inpatient care and stayed for 11 weeks. James reached his goal weight and gained four pounds. His mom had this to say: Thank you for the help that gave my son. My heart is very happy today because I see that he is happy and healed.
