- Pray for a traumatized 18yo girl who was robbed and violated in the attack March 3. She does not have a family to support her and is raising an 18 month old on her own.

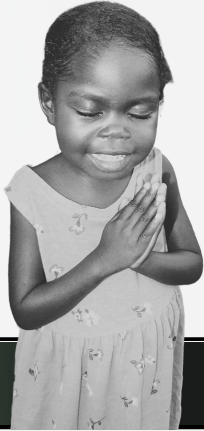


## Our Work

- Pray for the transitional council, a 9 member group installed as ruling authority to help move Haiti forward and plan new elections. After weeks of delays, they officially took their post April 25th. Please pray for clear vision, wise decisions, and clear communication and collaborating from this group moving forward. The gang violence is not slowing down, and we all have much work to accomplish to reestablish stability, security, and growth.
- Gang violence returned to Cabaret and Arcahaie in April, resulting in numerous deaths. Thankful the violence has not reached Cazale, but the situation is fragile. Please pray for the continued protection of our staff and our village, and also that God would be merciful to those living and surviving in difficult places.
- Please pray we continue to be able to maintain our supplies, as ports, and transport routes have been significantly disrupted. God continues to piece things together for us, and for that we are grateful. We were able to pick up 50 cases of medika mamba in north Haiti on April 24th, after the factory did not have any available in March. God has been exceedingly good to us, even in this challenging season.
- Pray for a new board member, J.S., who is joining our board of directors this month. Pray we onboard him well, and that the Lord might use his gifts and discernment to strengthen Real Hope for Haiti.

## Our Work

- Pray for the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to penetrate hearts and transform lives. Many are discouraged and losing hope, but as followers of Christ, we are not to be like those who are without hope. Pray God fills practicing Christians here with faith and that these trials we are enduring will produce perseverance, and perseverance will produce character, and character will produce a hope in all of us that will shine Christ's light bright!
- Food remains scarce with transportation issues, so pray for local farmers, as they are in planting season now and the rain is starting to fall. Pray God made a way their fields and gardens have bountiful harvest to provide for their families and our community.
