VALUE #3: GOD-CENTERED

We are strengthening relationships with individuals, families, our community, and Christ himself by living out the transforming all-consuming power of Christ in our lives as we answer the call to be his hands and feet to the people of Haiti. Colossians 3:17

CLINIC

We served 5,022 patients, including 2,054 children under 14. Birthing supplies, education, and consultations were done for 61 newborns and moms. Nurses did 2,381 dressings changes and managed 174 emergencies. We treated 495 skin infections and 231 fungal infections. Also 346 diarrhea cases were treated - 102 patients were admitted to our now-closed (Feb 4th) CTC, with 22 suspected of cholera. We identified and referred 13 new HIV+ cases. Group education focus was focused on accident prevention, mosquito control, and nutritional awareness.

RESCUE CENTER

Our inpatient care facility provided assistance to a total of 72 children. Of these, 29 were admitted due to illness and malnutrition. Unfortunately, we lost 5 children during their stay. On a positive note, 22 children recovered and were discharged to reunite with their families. During this period, we served a total of 11,112 meals. We hired and training 2 nurses for the USN. This initiative will enable us to have a nurse available full-time during day shifts, improving our capacity to deliver quality care to the children under our supervision.

OUTREACH

We enrolled 382 people in the mamba program, with 118 graduating. 4,176 meals reached 87 Food Box families monthly. Hope Homes sheltered 23 vulnerable children and 6 individuals received medical home support. Our education efforts include 21 school sponsorships and 5 university trainees (3 doctors, 1 nurse, 1 physical therapist) committed to joining RHFH. We also supported 14 displaced families with housing, business start-ups, and management training. We distributed 196 pieces of Biblical literature.

Battling severe symptoms of cholera, Luckenson's condition rapidly deteriorated, leaving him severely dehydrated. Immediate and effective treatment began upon their arrival to the CTC. Within four days, Luckenson made a miraculous recovery, returning to his cheerful, energetic self, thanks to the dedicated staff who not only treated him but also provided education.
