


REAL HOPE FOR HAITI

Kerwensky, a 9-month-old baby, weighed just 13 pounds due to severe malnutrition. Living with his family in a small home without running water, they farm bananas and vegetables to support themselves. After a long journey to the clinic, Kerwensky was diagnosed with kwashiorkor and admitted for care. He gained 4.5 pounds during his treatment.

D.T. recently faced a high fever, seizures, coughing, and breathing difficulties. With the help of the clinic's oxygen machine, we stabilized her condition. We're grateful to donors for providing these life-saving machines. Today, she is healthy and brings joy to her family.









Meet Wensky, brought to our clinic by his mother due to poor health. Living in a four-room house without running water, his family relies on an outhouse and a nearby water source. His father is a motorcycle taxi driver, and his mother resells goods. Diagnosed with severe malnutrition and a cold, Wensky was treated with F-75 milk and Medika Mamba. In four weeks, he made a remarkable recovery. Thank you for helping us make a difference!

Hydno fell seriously ill with severe diarrhea and vomiting. His family drove two hours to bring him to us. We quickly diagnosed him with cholera and started giving him IV fluids and oral rehydration solution. Hydno recovered quickly, and seeing him get better was incredibly rewarding for our entire team. We're thankful we could help and wish him and his family continued health and happiness.

Richalson who is 14 years old, lives with his farming family—his parents, brother, and sister. Recently, he faced a tough battle with cholera. The constant diarrhea, vomiting, and weakness left him unable to walk. In critical condition, Richalson was admitted to the Cholera Treatment Center (CTC). There, he received immediate care, including 2 liters of Ringer's solution intravenously and 8 liters of oral serum to restore his electrolyte balance. After three days of dedicated treatment, Richalson showed significant improvement and was ready to return home. Richalson expressed heartfelt gratitude to the CTC staff for their care. He was overjoyed to reunite with his family and thanked everyone who supported him. He recognized the effective treatment and loving attention as true blessings and hoped that this vital work would continue to help more people in need.







I wanted to share the importance of our small emergency room at the clinic. Recently, J.M. came to us with a serious infection. He had removed a thorn from his foot, which then developed into a badly infected abscess. The wound had a concerning color and smell. cleaned and drained the wound, packed it, and referred him for medication. J.M. returned every day for a month for dressing changes.

By the end of his treatment, he expressed deep gratitude, believing our care saved his leg, or even his life. He mentioned there is no other place nearby that provides such vital services. This story is just one of thousands we encounter. Our emergency room is crucial for the people in our area and beyond. It saves lives and offers essential care that isn't available elsewhere. Thank you for your continued support, which makes this life-saving work possible.
