### Value #4 : Collaboration/Community

### MEDICAL CLINIC

Outpatient medical care for internal medicine, pediatrics, malnutrition, emergencies, pre/postnatal, lab, pharmacy, and health education

Of the 5559 patients we served, 2118 were children under 14 yrs and 591 were given food and support. There were 481 prenatal visits and 52 moms and babies were supported in childbirth and aftercare. The lab did 3550 tests on 1202 patients. There were 107 vials of insulin, 66325 multivitamins, and 35520 tylenol distributed. We cared for 78 diabetics and 452 patients with hypertension. Vitamin supplements were given to 373 kids and 1107 people were dewormed.

### Wound Care & ER

We cared for 180 emergencies, changed 2541 dressings, gave 1192 injections, and started 24 IVs. There were 2 children with 7 broken bones who we arranged to receive surgery at other hospitals. There were 67 lacerations sutured and 11 burns treated. There was 1 suicide attempt and 12 injuries due to violence.

### Education & Outreach

Group education was focused on malnutrition, child development, and combating discouragement, where over 4600 people were reached. Staff education was centered on trauma and healthy ways to process stress. Sponsorships for 5 medical professionals and 21 school children continue. Two people accepted Jesus and 172 pieces of Christian literature was shared.

### RESCUE CENTER

Inpatient care for severely malnourished children, wounded patients, and those needing more intensive care to recover

Our inpatient care facility provided assistance to a total of 45 children. Of these, 20 were newly admitted due to illness and malnutrition. Unfortunately, we lost 3 children during their stay. On a positive note, 22 children recovered and were discharged to reunite with their families. There were 176 family visits with the children. The child to nanny ratio averaged 4:1 this quarter. There were 9450 sacks of mamba and 333 containers of milk given to the kids to aid in recovery.

### Hope Homes

We are dedicated to providing safe and nurturing homes for abandoned and at-risk children. Our foster care program has successfully placed 24 children in loving homes. This quarter there were 27 home visits that were completed. While we are excited with this progress, we are continuing our efforts to find stable and loving homes for 2 additional children in our care.
