- Pray for D.L. who recently got surgery. Pray for his family who are learning how to feed him through a tube so he can begin to gain weight and reverse the effects of malnutrition.
- N.P. is a lady needing prayer as she lost significant weight and strength. Pray our staff can diagnose the illness correctly and treatment would turn her condition around.
- S.E. is a young man who is discouraged and does not see a path forward towards a better life. He asks for God would deliver him from feeling hopeless.
- R.M.F. is a woman who is having difficulty breathing and feels like she is decompensating physically overall and desires God to intervene in her life to heal her.
- E.H. is a patient who feels under attack by an evil spirit and wants prayer for deliverance and victory in Jesus.
- The recent hostility between the gangs near us with the city of Arcahaie seem to have calmed down, which is a true answer to prayer. So thank you for joining us as we lifted it up to our Lord last month. This was a positive development, however, the gangs nearest us did come into Cazale twice in November and steal vehicles. They did not engage us or bother us in any way, but their proximity is concerning. Please pray for the protection of our staff and patients. We do have evacuation plans and are grateful for many of our Haitian staff that are willing to leave Cazale to care for those children that are in our care if necessary. We have some contingencies lined up. Pray for discernment along the way.
- The current presidential council engaged in yet another shake up of the political landscape, firing the former Prime Minister and installing a new one. The lack of continuity and clear leadership continues to plague efforts to curtail gang violence and move the country forward. Please pray for deeper and truer cooperation between all the decision makers in Haiti.
- Recently we have seen a steep uptick in the number of acute malnutrition cases. The longer the current situation persists, the more problematic it will become in our communities. Pray God would provide for the communities we live in with sufficient rains and bountiful harvest. Pray for increased imports that alleviate food security issues. Pray as well as many homes have swelled with displaced people relocating to our area after fleeing their homes several times over the last two years.
- Pray for new potential RHFH board members who are in the process of onboarding. We hope to have them engaged in board activities by the beginning of 2025.
- Please pray for three medical school students we sponsored in school who are finishing their training soon. We also have nursing and other medical professionals sponsored at various points in their education as well as a chaplain in Seminary. The education is becoming somewhat fractured due to instability and frequent closures.

This interrupts our missionary flight service that brings us critical supplies, so pray for some resolution or relief considerations for humanitarian purposes.
- Pray for many of our fellow missionaries that were forced to leave Haiti due to violence, many of which had lost property from looting and are discouraged. Pray the Lord be near to them, grant them wisdom and discernment as well as faith for a brighter future here in Haiti.

- As stated above, please pray for the safety and security of our staff missionaries in the current unpredictable climate. Licia Betor and Casey & Briana Zachary plan to depart Haiti in December, while Lori and her husband Charly will remain in Cazale.
- Pray Licia, Briana and Casey will joyously reunite with their children and families when they return to the USA. Pray for their safe passage over to the Dominican Republic border and flights from there, as flying from Haiti is not a viable option at present.
- Pray for Abigail as she finishes up her first full quarter at college. Pray God directs, strengthens, and equips her as she moves forward.
- Pray for Miss Anna's family back in Alabama as they will be enduring the holidays for the first time since Anna's going to be with Jesus. Pray comfort and grace for them all.
