Ruben, a 49-year-old man from Cabaret, was going through a difficult time. His hand was severely swollen, and the pain left him feeling alone and hopeless. As chaplains, we spent time with him, praying and reminding him that God never abandons us, even in our darkest moments. We gave him a Bible to encourage him and help him draw closer to God's word. Ruben began reading the Scriptures and found comfort in Jesus' promises. He realized that even in his pain and loneliness, Jesus was always near. This understanding brought him peace and strengthened his faith. With new hope, Ruben accepted Jesus as his Savior, discovering a true friend and comforter in his suffering. His journey reminds us of the transformative power of God's love in every circumstance.

Jean Mary, a 20-year-old farmer living with his family, came to the clinic to treat a fever and flu. During his consultation, he requested a Bible, expressing his desire to read more of God's Word. We were joyful to gift him a Bible, and he received it with gratitude, saying, "Thank you, because when times are hard, I can read the Bible to learn about this wonderful God and find comfort, knowing



I have a heavenly Father who watches over me." We rejoice in seeing Jean Mary open his heart to Jesus, finding in Him the strength and peace he needs in life.



40-month-old Wilbens, а boy, was admitted to the nutrition center with mild malnutrition and 2+ edema, weighing 29 pounds. We created a treatment plan to treat malnutrition, reduce swelling, and restore health. Our team cared for him daily, ensuring he ate, took his medication, and even enjoyed playtime. After two months, Wilbens had fully recovered, weighing 31 pounds, and returned home healthy. We thank our donors for making this care possible for children like Wilbens.

My name is Félicienne, I am 42 years old, and I live with my three sons and my daughter. Today, I feel a deep peace because I have accepted Jesus as my Savior. When I was sick, I came to the clinic for treatment, where I met the chaplains. At each appointment, they prayed with me, supporting me and encouraging me to place my faith in God. With the help of their prayers and the medical care, I regained my health. I thank God for this healing and pray that He blesses this great family who helped me find hope and peace in Him.



VISION: Physically, relationally, and spiritually healthy people contributing to thriving families and strong communities as God designed and desires.

Esther, a 16-month-old girl, was admitted to our nutrition center with severe malnutrition (grade 4) and 1+ edema, weighing only 10 pounds 6 ounces. With her parents' consent, we kept her at the center for specialized care and treatment. Her recovery plan included medication, three types of nutritious food, and enrollment in the Medika Mamba program.

For nearly five months, our team dedicated themselves to Esther's care, feeding her, administering medication, bathing her, and playing with her. Every day brought new progress, as her edema gradually subsided, her weight increased, and the signs of malnutrition faded.

Seeing Esther heal filled us with joy. Despite some tough days, her resilience shone through, and she steadily regained her health. By the time she was 21 months old, she weighed 15 pounds 14 ounces and was ready to return home to her family, healthy and thriving.





Nadège, 49, lives with her daughter in Cabaret. She came to the clinic in a fragile state of health: her weight was very low and she needed her family's help to walk. We prayed for her and put her name on our prayer list. After tests, she received appropriate treatment. At the next appointment, she arrived alone, walking without assistance. Touched by our support, Nadège agreed to reconnect with her faith and to place her life in the hands of Jesus, feeling a new peace. She shared: "Thank you for the comforting words you gave me, which reminded me that God's promises remain present, even when we move away. Through your advice, I found the strength to return to Him. Thank you very much."

As a nurse working with malnourished children, I want to share Talisha's story. At 15 months, she was admitted to the AK-1000 flour program due to severe malnutrition, high fevers, and abdominal pain. We treated her with medication and provided protein-rich flour for her meals.

At her follow-up a month later, Talisha had gained weight, her pain was gone, and her fevers had vanished. Your support makes this possible—thank you for helping children like Talisha thrive.
