Our Work

- We are grateful for your prayers last month as gang members were coming into Cazale at their leisure. They continue to circulate in the area, but the situation locally has not escalated for us, by the grace and mercy of God. Continue to pray for protection.
- Pray for our truck and our staff that are making multiple trips per month to Cap Haitien in north Haiti to secure supplies and bring them back to Cazale. We are thankful for this safe (gang-free) route and desire prayer it remains open for travel.
- Pray for leadership in Haiti to emerge. The current Presidential Council of 9 members have a mandate to hold elections in 2025 to inaugurate a new president on February 7, 2026. It does not appear much progress is being made towards that end.
- Pray for a couple of patients that we are referring for treatment elsewhere. One has a bad fracture of their wrist, and we are trying to coordinate surgery for him at a still functioning hospital in Port au Prince. Also pray for a lady with uterine cancer that needs a hysterectomy. We have arranged for that surgery as well, but are having difficulty getting units of blood from the Red Cross. Please pray we can get this blood so this woman can receive live saving care.



- Pray for several of our former staff and friends who have immigrated into the United States in the last few years under the Parole Program. There is a lot of fear and uncertainty about their future. They are hard working men and women, looking for a safer environment for them and their families.
- We are grateful to add two additional board members to begin 2025. Please continue to pray for our board as we continue to work together to improve protocols and policies, evaluate programs, and cast a vision for the future.

- Pray for Lori and Charly who remain in Haiti and bear the brunt of the triaging the needs that come through our gate each day.
- Pray for Licia and her family who are currently in Indiana. Licia works hard and put in a lot of hours to help RHFH remotely and we are very thankful for her contributions and her general uplifting encouragement to our Haitian staff.
- Pray for Casey and Briana and their kids who had a joyful reunion in Washington state just before Christmas after being apart for some months. Pray they have wisdom on how to navigate where best to be for RHFH and for their kids in 2025.
