

# QUARTERLY IMPACT REPORT

2025 : Quarter 2



## Vision:

Physically, relationally, and spiritually healthy people contributing to thriving families and strong communities as God designed and desires.

### MEDICAL CLINIC

Outpatient medical care for general medicine, pediatrics, malnutrition, emergencies, pre/postnatal, lab, pharmacy, and health education

Of the 6807 patients we served, 2381 were children under 14 yrs and 411 were given food and support. There were 546 prenatal visits and 69 moms and babies were supported in childbirth and aftercare. The lab did 5245 tests on 1310 patients. There were 116 vials of insulin, 47948 multivitamins, and 37300 tylenol distributed. We cared for 99 diabetics and 509 patients with hypertension. We provided 2,441 wound care dressings and treated 214 emergencies.

### Wound Care & ER

We cared for 214 emergencies, changed 2441 dressings, gave 1686 injections, and started 23 IVs. There were 7 patients with broken bones who we arranged to receive surgery and care at other hospitals. There were 56 lacerations sutured and 29 burns treated. There were 72 injuries due to road accidents.

### Education & Outreach

Group education for patients was focused on preventing skin infections, brain development in children, and affection/attachment, where over 6500 people were reached. Staff education was centered on trauma and healthy ways to process stress. Sponsorships for 4 medical professionals and 27 school children continue. Four people accepted Jesus, 4519 heard the Gospel, and 4 Bibles were distributed.

### RESCUE CENTER

Inpatient care for severely malnourished children, wounded patients, and those needing more intensive care to recover

Our inpatient care facility provided support to 53 children this month. Among them, 15 were newly admitted for treatment of illness and malnutrition. Sadly, we experienced the loss of 2 children during their stay. On a positive note, 10 children regained their health and were discharged to return home with their families. Throughout the month, we served 7,429 meals to children and parents. This included 730 pieces of chicken, 1,064 cups of beans, 3,744 cookies, and we used 193 pounds of laundry soap.

### Hope Homes

We are committed to providing safe and nurturing homes for abandoned and at-risk children. Our foster care program has successfully placed 26 children in loving families. Over the past quarter, we conducted 32 home visits and completed 79 medical check-ups. We were also grateful to place 2 children into long-term, supportive family environments during this time..
