## RESCUE CENTER

A total of 52 children were served in the Rescue Center this quarter, and we are deeply thankful that there were no deaths during this time. Throughout the quarter, the team prepared and served 3,441 meals, including 2,440 pieces of chicken and 966 cups of beans. We also used 166 bars of soap and provided 3,568 crackers as part of daily nutrition and care. Many of the children are showing steady recovery thanks to the dedicated inpatient care they receive each day. Their strength, weight, and overall health continue to improve through proper nutrition, medication, and therapy. We are truly grateful that the Rescue Center continues to operate and provide consistent support, nourishment, and hope to the children we serve.



## CLINIC

There were 7092 patient consultations, including 2,389 children and 587 prenatal visits. Our team performed 2,782 dressing changes and supported 81 births, while 16 new HIV+ cases were identified, allowing us to offer critical care and support. The lab conducted 4,433 tests, ensuring comprehensive diagnostics. Educational sessions focused on key themes like "Domestic Violence," "Family Responsibility," and "Strategies to Combat Discouragement." Additionally, we continued supporting 5 university students — 1 doctor, 1 nurse, 1 physical therapist, and 2 social workers — who are committed to joining Real Hope For Haiti after graduation.



## HOPE HOMES

The Hope Homes program continues to thrive as we focus on providing quality care and support to children and families. During this past quarter, we conducted 29 home visits, ensuring each child in the program receives the attention and assistance they need. The children enjoyed summer vacation, spending time with family and friends and swimming in the river—a joyful break. As the new school year approaches, they are eagerly preparing to return to class. Two employees will begin online school for social work in November. We've also updated each child's binder to keep records current and organized.



## OTHER

**SPIRITUAL:** There were 492 people who requested special prayer and 728 who received spiritual counsel. Chaplains distributed 1284 pieces of Christian literature.

**EDUCATION:** We have been getting 25 children ready to begin school soon, equipping them with uniforms, books, and all the necessary supplies for a strong start to the year

**CONSTRUCTION:** Rock walls were built to combat erosion. There was an outhouse and small room built for use for community group activities and plant nursery.

**FORMULA:** This past quarter, we provided 151 cans of infant formula to support 19 children who had no availability for someone to breastfeed them.
