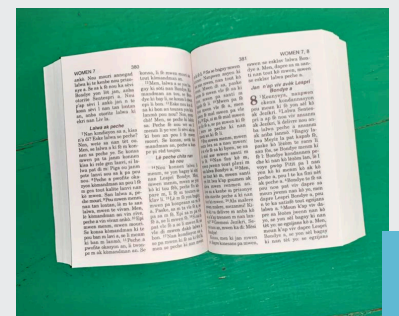

After completing nine months of TB treatment, he has finally been cleared to prepare for surgery. Throughout this long journey, we have prayed with him, encouraged him, and walked beside him. One morning during devotion, Isnadin chose to give his life to Jesus. As he prepares for what comes next, we continue to stand with him in faith and hope.

Guidelène came to live in a Hope Home and received surgery as a baby for a cleft lip and palate. Today she is healthy, joyful, and growing more confident each day. She enjoys school, laughs often, and knows what it means to feel safe and cared for. Watching her thrive reminds us how love, stability, and continued care can shape a child's future.



Franceline was only 25 pounds when she first came to the clinic and had a fungal infection. We followed the nutrition program and came back each month. Three months later, she gained weight, the infection cleared, and her health returned. Today she eats well, plays actively, and is full of life. I am so grateful for the care and support that made this possible.

Every month I came to the clinic during my pregnancy. One day, the chaplains spoke to me about God's love, and I felt something change in my heart. That day, with my little boy beside me, I surrendered my life to God. They gave me a Bible, and I left filled with joy, knowing I now belong to His family.

One sunny morning in the clinic courtyard, we received an unexpected visit from a former patient of the nutrition center named Samuel. As a child, he was admitted twice for severe malnutrition. The first time, at just five years old, he spent an entire year at the center receiving the care, nutrition, and attention he needed to survive and regain his strength. During both stays, he received what he needed to recover and return home. After his second admission, Samuel returned to his family, continued school, and never needed to come back for care. Ten years later, now 20 years old, he returned to the clinic—not as a patient, but simply to say thank you. Samuel lives with his parents, five brothers, and one sister. His family depends on farming, and life has not always been easy. Standing in the courtyard, Samuel shared his gratitude and said that without the care he received as a child, he might not be alive today. Samuel's visit is a powerful reminder of the long-lasting impact of faithful support. Thank you for changing lives far beyond what you may ever see.



Five-year-old Irana arrived at our nutrition center very sick, with severe malnutrition and swelling. With her mother by her side, we cared for her every day—feeding, giving medications, bathing, playing, and monitoring her closely. Day by day, her swelling went down, her appetite returned, and her weight increased. After nearly a month, she was healthy, happy, and able to return home with her family. Seeing her smile again reminded us why we do this work.

Phalancia came to the clinic with a high fever, poor appetite, and weight loss. We treated her illness and enrolled her in the Medika Mamba program, explaining carefully how to give it each day. With follow-up visits and consistent nutrition, her appetite returned and she gained weight. Two months later, she was fully recovered. Seeing a child regain strength like this is always encouraging.
