Carolle traveled two hours from Arcahaie, her heart failing and body swollen with fluid. She couldn't breathe lying down, and her condition was critical. Our chaplains sat beside her, spoke gently, and lifted their voices in prayer, asking God for His mercy and healing. After this moment of prayer, doctors began her treatment. At each follow-up visit, the chaplains continued praying with Carolle, encouraging her to trust in God's power to heal. Two months later, she returned transformed - the swelling gone, breathing normal, hope restored. The chaplains gave thanks to God, praising Him for using the medications and care to bring about her healing. Through prayer, faithful medical treatment, and God's grace, Carolle's life was restored.


Lina (7 yrs) arrived at our nutrition center weighing just 27 pounds, suffering from severe malnutrition and anemia. Her small body was swollen with edema, and her hemoglobin was low at 9.6 g/dL. For 3 months, our team provided round-the-clock care: therapeutic milk, nutritious foods through the Medika Mamba program, medications, and plenty of love and playtime. Slowly, Lina transformed. At discharge, she weighed a healthy 36 pounds with a hemoglobin level of 11.3 g/dL. Today, she's home with her family—thriving, playing, and full of life again.

Eight-year-old Clerline traveled six hours from Beilac with her family, struggling with flu, cough, and dangerously low weight. Enrolled in our Medika Mamba program, she received 28 nutritional sachets monthly along with consistent medical care. Gradually, Clerline gained weight and her appetite returned. Best of all? Her smile came back. "I'm so relieved to see her healthy again," her mother told us. Thanks to our donors, Clerline is thriving.

My daughter Nehémie is 7 years old. We live in Beilac with my other children, and life is not easy for us. When Nehémie became sick, I was terrified. She had a high fever that wouldn't break and she was so thin. She weighed only 35 pounds, far too little for a girl her age. She had no appetite and barely had the energy to play. I brought her to the clinic, not knowing what was wrong or if they could help her. The doctors examined her carefully and started treatment immediately. Every week, we made the journey back to the clinic (3 hour walk one way) so they could monitor her progress. Slowly, I watched my daughter transform. The swelling in her face went down. Her fever disappeared. She started eating again and asking for food. Week by week, she gained weight and strength. Now she weighs almost 40 pounds and runs around with her siblings like she used to. I am so grateful to the donors who made this possible. You gave me my healthy, happy daughter back. Thank you for caring about children like Nehémie and families like ours.



Sophia, a 26-month-old girl, arrived at our clinic suffering from severe malnutrition, anemia, swelling, and hair loss and early signs of kwashiorkor. Living with her father and grandmother in extreme poverty, she lacked consistent access to nutritious food. Upon admission, Sophia began therapeutic care, starting with stabilization milk and transitioning to Medika Mamba to support recovery. With consistent medical treatment and nutrition, her health steadily improved. After nine weeks, her weight increased from 15 lbs to 21 lbs, and her hemoglobin levels rose. Today, Sophia is stronger, healthier, and full of new hope. We are grateful for compassionate care and generous donors

I am 78 years old, and I was taking care of my goats when my foot hit a tree stump. I fell hard and injured my head badly. My family brought me to the clinic right away. The nurses welcomed me with such care and compassion. They cleaned my wound gently, stitched it carefully with quality sutures, and gave me medication for the pain. For weeks, I came back every two days so they could change my dressings and check on my healing. Today, my wound is completely healed, and I am back with my goats again, thankful for the care I received.
