Vision:

MEDICAL CLINIC

Outpatient medical care for general medicine, pediatrics, malnutrition, emergencies, pre/postnatal, lab, pharmacy, and health education

Of the 6483 patients we served, 2066 were children under 14 yrs and 428 were given food and support. There were 589 prenatal visits and 69 moms and babies were supported in childbirth and aftercare. The lab did 5321 tests on 1527 patients. There were 150 vials of insulin, 97200 multivitamin pills, and 52800 tylenol pills distributed in the quarter. We cared for 107 diabetics and 503 patients with hypertension.

Wound Care & ER

We cared for 145 emergencies, changed 2576 dressings, gave 1468 injections, and started 5 IVs. There were 7 patients with broken bones who we arranged to receive surgery and care at other hospitals. There were 49 lacerations sutured and 20 burns treated. There were 60 injuries due to road accidents.

Education & Outreach

Group education for patients was focused on managing chronic illness, preventing teen pregnancies, and breastfeeding, where over 5700 people were reached. Staff education was centered on CPR, evacuation procedures, and mass casualty drills. Sponsorships for 6 medical professionals and 24 school children continue. Two people accepted Jesus and 126 pieces of Biblical literature were distributed.

RESCUE CENTER

Inpatient care for severely malnourished children, wounded patients, and those needing more intensive care to recover

Our inpatient care facility provided support to 62 children this quarter. Among them, 14 were newly admitted for treatment of illness and malnutrition. We are grateful that we did not experience the loss of any children during this period. On a positive note, 10 children regained their health and were discharged to return home with their families. Throughout the quarter, we served 7,100 meals to children and parents. This included 870 pieces of chicken, 1,008 cups of beans, 1,484 cups of rice, 1,498 gallons of water consumed, and 195 pounds of laundry soap used.

Hope Homes

We are committed to providing safe and nurturing homes for abandoned and at-risk children. Our foster care program currently has 25 children placed in loving families. Over the past quarter, we conducted 10 home visits and completed 86 medical check-ups. Eighteen of these children are attending school, and we were grateful to welcome 1 child into a long-term, supportive family environment during this time.
